## FAQs – Cambridge Technical Art and Design

**Q:** *My son/daughter may need to resit his/hers Maths GCSE. Is this possible on the full time art course?*

**A:** Yes, they can study one GCSE course alongside their chosen course.

**Q:** *Can my son/daughter take an A Level alongside Cambridge Technical Art and Design?*

**A:** Cambridge Technical Art and Design is a two year course and is equivalent to three A Levels, so there is no need for an extra A level.

**Q:** *What is the structure of this course?*

**A:** This is a two year course covering eighteen units in total, with nine units each year, covering all art disciplines.

**Q:** *Is this course appropriate for entry onto degree?*

**A:** Students studying Cambridge Technical Art and Design (CamTech) build up a diverse portfolio over the two years and can apply directly for a university course. Usually these are in creative subjects like Art, Design or Media.

They do not need to study on a one year foundation course.

**Q:** *Do I need experience of all the areas before I start?*

**A:** No, previous experience is not necessary, as you will be taught by subject specialists who will introduce you to a variety of new and exciting techniques and processes.
