

FAQs – Sociology

Q: *What's the difference between Sociology & Psychology?*

A: Psychology is about how internal factors affect an individual's life chances/behaviour, whereas Sociology explores the external factors e.g., other people and institutions

Q: *Can I study both?*

A: Yes, it's a very popular choice, and they complement each other.

Q: *What careers are linked to Sociology?*

A: It doesn't necessarily lead to a specific career, it will provide you with a range of analytical & academic skills.

Past students have gone to train as architects, police officers, teachers, social workers to name just a few.

Q: *What subjects go well with Sociology?*

A: Geography, History, Politics, Economics and Law

Q: *I haven't studied GCSE Sociology*

A: That doesn't matter, we assume no prior knowledge, and the majority of our students haven't studied the subject at GCSE level.
